## **Message from the Principal**

Dear Families,

### Thank you

I have been overwhelmed by the number of people who have welcomed the news of my appointment as Principal at Mother Teresa. I really appreciate all your support!

#### **WSAPBS**

Meg Irwin and I have been reviewing the current behaviour management practices throughout the school. Next week, we will be surveying students from Years 3-6 and staff about existing practices. Going forward, we will be moving to a Whole School Approach to Positive Behaviour Support. There are a number of stages in implementing this effectively and it will take time but we will work with the School Board and keep you informed about our progress. School-wide positive behaviour support (SWPBS) is a framework that brings together school communities to develop positive, safe, supportive learning cultures. SWPBS assists schools to improve social, emotional, behavioural and academic outcomes for children and young people. When SWPBS is implemented well, teachers and students have more time to focus on relationships and classroom instruction.

#### Students and staff benefit from:

- increased respectful and positive behaviour
- increased time focused on instruction
- improved social-emotional wellbeing
- positive and respectful relationships among students and staff
- increased adoption of evidence-based instructional practices
- a predictable learning environment with improved perceptions of safety and increased attendance.

#### **Reconciliation Week**

Next week, the students will be participating in a range of activities to acknowledge Reconciliation Week. The theme this year is, 'Now more than ever'. On Monday, members from Larrakia Nation will be cooking a sausage sizzle for the students. They will need to bring their lunch as normal but will be able to enjoy a sausage as well.

Throughout the week, the students will engage in the following:

- <u>Transition</u> Bush tucker with Shannon Motlop
- Year 1 and 2 Staff from Bunnings will work with the students to paint pots for Reconciliation Week
- Year 3 and 4 Canvas painting
- Year 5 and 6- Native jewelry and key chain weaving
- Year 6 boys- Cooking underground

I would like to extend my heartfelt gratitude to Tearna Pearce for all her hard work getting these activities organised.

**Location:** Bloodwood Park








